WHAT IS A PESTICIDE?

PESTICIDES AND TOXIC CHEMICALS CONTROL BOARD





PESTICIDE MEANS ANY SUBSTANCE WHICH BY IT-SELF, OR IN COMBINATION WITH OTHER SUB-STANCES, IS PROPOSED, REPRESENTED, OR USED FOR DESTROYING OR CONTROLLING PESTS BUT DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY ANTISEPTIC, DISINFEC-TANT, DRUG OR PRESERVATIVE.

Examples of Pesticides:

- (1) Agricultural Insecticides
- (2) Herbicides
- (3) Fungicides
- (4) Household Insecticides (Mosquito Coils, Aerosols, Vaporisers, Mats)
- (5) Pet Care Products containing Pesticides
- (6) Insect Repellents
- (7) Algaecides
- (8) Pesticide Products used in the Pest Control Industry
- (9) Paint based Fungicides.



PROCEDURE FOR REGISTRATION OF A PESTICIDE

- Application received and processed by Registrar.
- Publication in daily newspaper.
- Waiting period of 21 days for receipt of public comments.
- Application presented to Screening Committee, a technical sub-committee of the Board.
- Recommendation made
 - Approval
 - Not Approved
 - Recommended
 - Deferred
- Recommendations taken to Board for final approval.
- Certificate of Registration issued to applicant by Registrar.
